

Any nation that has created an extraordinary drink is proud of it.
For the Scottish this drink is their single malt whisky.
It is made from malted barley and originates from a distilling process in a distillery.

The distinctive regional features stem from different factors, like climatic influences, traditions, or preferences, e.g. for more or less smoke, the distiller's personal skills to the storing and maturing process.

All these, as well as many more variable influences, give each single malt whisky its distinctive character.

Single malt whiskies should be drunk without ice or soda from a nosing glass.

Some single malts open up and release more flavors when diluted with water.

With this menu you have a first-class choice of different whiskies. You can match the single malts to the respective regions and you are given tasting notes considering color, smell and taste of each whisky.





Lowlands

Auchentoshan

12 Years, 40 %

This honey-colored whisky has a flowery and fruity smell like mashed banana and nutty malt. The smooth body is oily and reveals traces of malt, caramel and oranges.

Glenkinchie Distillers Edition

12 years, 43 %

The usually light Glenkinchie of the classic malt series wins body through exclusive storage in Amontillado sherry casks. Its taste is intense, a blend of sweetness, malt and wooden flavors. The finish is comparatively long and drying

Highlands

The Glenlivet (*Speyside*)

15 years, 40%

This whisky developed out of the archive bottling, in which only a few barrels were bottled without any reference to age. Nowadays age is considered as well as excellence. This results in a complex whisky, which is spicy and has a ripe, smooth and full fruity taste. A real treasure among the single malts!

Aberfeldy (*Speyside*)

12 years, 40%

Wild mountain honey, Scottish heather, notes of pineapple, roasting flavors and cereals are the core features of this wonderfully silky single Highland malt Scotch whisky from the small distillery of Aberfeldy.

Dalmore (*east Highlands*)

12 years, 40%

This single malt is really special. Having matured in American Bourbon and Spanish Oloroso sherry casks it is unbelievably complex and aromatic and stands out from the crowd with many different flavors.

Royal Lochnagar (*east Highlands*)

12 years, 40%

This single malt has been part of the Classic Malts Collection since 2005. A strong first impression with a slight smokiness and the flavor of sherry casks make this single malt very pleasant. The distillery is situated close to Balmoral Castle, the Scottish home of the queen. Queen Victoria appreciated it very much!

Aberlour (*Speyside*)

10 years, 40%

This is a mild and soft single malt whisky from Speyside with a full, malty and spicy flavor. Its taste originates from the sherry casks it matured in. This is the classic single malt from Aberlour distillery!

Balvenie Double Wood (*Speyside*)

12 years, 40%

The storage in old sherry and bourbon casks makes this malt interesting and mild. Its orange flavor and a deep sweet taste are recommended among malt whisky connoisseurs!

Knockando (*Speyside*)

12 years, 43%

This bottling made Knockando famous. Nutty, malty flavors caress palate and nose.

Glendronach (*Speyside*)

12 years, 40%

Its flavor is sweet with vanilla, a hint of ginger, spices and a trace of pears. Its taste is rich and creamy with warming sherry and fruits. Its finish is long, drying and nutty.

Cragganmore (*Speyside*)

12 years, 40%

This single malt stands out with an extraordinary balance of flavor, taste and finish.

This 12 year old is malty, dry and slightly smoky and is perfect for sensitive palates. There are no strong outstanding flavors, this malt rather convinces with its elegant balance.

Dalwhinnie (*zentrales Hochland*)

15 years, 43%

This bottling of Dalwhinnie is one of the best-selling classic malts of Scotland.

Its flavor has tinges of heather and peat smoke.

The mild, fruity-sweet taste leads to an excellent long finish.

Cardhu (*Speyside*)

12 years, 40%

Its extraordinary flavor and taste make Cardhu a reference among the single malts of Speyside. This single malt has a warm and pure taste that is often called silky.

Glenmorangie Original (*northern Highlands*)

10 years, 40%

This single malt has a fresh, flowery and spicy flavor. Its mild malty taste leads to a long sweet finish. This is the best-selling single malt in Scotland.

The Edradour (*central Highlands*)

10 years, 40%

Edradour is the smallest producing distillery in Scotland. They produce as much whisky in a year as big distilleries produce in a week. This single malt is very intensive with a clear influence of sherry casks.

Oban (*western Highlands*)

14 years, 43%

Oban belongs to the Classic Malts of Scotland. The first impression is clearly smoky and spicy. As the distillery is close to the sea, sea flavors and a slight saltiness are prominent.

Macallan (*Speyside*)

12 years, 40%

To the nose there are flavors of sherry, honey and flowers, these are followed by a balanced sweet and soft taste. The Oloroso sherry is present in taste and flavor. The finish is rich, long and warming. This is the classic of Macallan!

Glen Elgin (*Speyside*)

12 years, original bottling, 43%

Glen Elgin 12 years, is the prime example of a Speyside single malt whisky: dry but full of character, light but complex. Sweet fruity and heathery flavors combine with a marvelous spiciness.

Campbeltown

Springbank

Smoke and coconut flavors as well as a subtle saltiness unfold due to the higher alcohol content. The Springbank 12 years cask strength is voluminous and full bodied. Caramel, cinnamon, oranges and tangerine flavors emerge and lead to a sweet long finish with a tinge of smoke.

Inseln

Bowmore Enigma (*Islay*)

12 years, 40%

This is a super Bowmore! An absolutely balanced malt whisky with a blend of sweet sherry, smoke, honey and lemon flavors. Dark and secretive it delights the palate by playing with the change of smoke and sweetness, salt and honey. Just excellent!

Lagavulin (*Islay*)

16 years, 43%

The Classic Malt of Islay offers intensive peat smoke, powerfully maritime with iodine and seaweed, intertwined with sherry flavors. There is an elegant sweetness hidden among these flavors that leads to a very long,, strong and full finish. Lagavulin 16 years is overwhelmingly complex, sovereign and elegant.

Laphoraig (*Islay*)

10 years, 40%

This famous malt has an extreme peaty flavor with tinges of seaweed and the sea. This is one of the most intensive Islay malts. You either hate him or love him.

Scapa (*Orkney*)

14 years, 40 %

With its 14 years this malt stands out with its strong toffee sweetness. The taste is dominated by dry fruits, oranges and thick honey sweetness. Its finish is long and drying.

Highland Park (*Orkney*)

18 years, 43%

This malt is amazingly smoky with tinges of sherry and oak. The full bodied taste leads to a complex, long finish. No wonder this single malt often wins medals at blind tastings.

Isle of Jura Legacy (*Jura*)

10 years, 40%

This Jura single malt is very soft and sweetish due to its storage in sherry casks. Its intensity changes into complexity. The sherry casks add the fruitiness to its exciting taste

Talisker (*Skye*)

10 years, 45,8%

Its flavor is smoky and malty-sweet. Its taste is suitably strong, explosive, even spicy. This is followed by a powerful finish, a real "heater". Talisker is one of the spiciest malts that are available.

7 years, 47.5% (259th bottle of 342)

The Scottish water of life "uisge beatha" is alive! This whisky comes from the Tobermory distillery on the Isle of Mull.

Ledaig is the peated version of the single malts produced in the Tobermory distillery. (The non-peated variant is offered as "Tobermory".)

This single malt has matured in hogshead for 7 years exclusively for us and then finished in a sherry butt for 6 years.

Distilled: 8 November 2005, cask number 50/1

Filling: 26 August 2013 in Scotland

Color: dark straw

Flavor: plenty of peat and smoke, malty, salty and peppery notes

Taste: smoky, fruity

Aftertaste: smoky with a sweet note and a warming finish
